

Pastor's Corner... Fr. Robert Aliunzi, A.J.

WE HAVE COME A LONG WAY, BUT THE GOOD NEWS: HE IS RISEN ALLELUIA,!

Indeed, we have come a long way. For forty days, we have done various acts of piety and spiritual exercises. Some of us gave up indulging in our favorite activities, gave up certain food or drinks that we love. We have fasted, prayed a little more and gave some help and alms here and there to the poor and needy. But for what purpose? We did all these in an attempt to enter more deeply into the paschal mystery of our Lord Jesus. We have come a long way, but whatever we have done and experienced cannot be compared with what Our Lord suffered for our sins.

Over the last couple of days, we saw with horror the painful and distressing betrayal of our Lord by his self-avowed intimate inner circle, the Apostles, at his most desperate hour of need. We saw the blatant travesty of justice as he was condemned by the religious leaders and the crowds through a sham trial, a trial that has continued to scandalize even the best legal minds of the world throughout the centuries. Then we saw his slow and brutal crucifixion on the cross by the Roman soldiers who all the while continued to taunt and mock him joined by his fellow "condemnees". Then he died, a death that seemingly terminated a glorious career of a great teacher and miracle worker, who just a week before had pulled crowds chanting Hosanna in his honor. What a week, what a painful drama! Indeed, we have come a long way!

However, despite all these, there is a happy ending. Death does not have the last laugh, life does - He is Risen, Alleluia! This is what we are celebrating today! He is risen, the tomb is empty! Yes, the tomb was empty, the tomb is still empty. That is the good news of Easter.

St. John and all the Gospel writers spend a lot of time describing the empty tomb – the women came to the tomb, they found the stone had been rolled away and the tomb was empty. Peter and John ran to the tomb, they entered the tomb and found the tomb empty. The concentration is around the tomb and the empty tomb.

The empty tomb is not a serious theological proof of the resurrection but it is an indication. And this is so because the resurrection is not a reality of this world but a reality of the world to come. It is not even a reality of time and space but of eternity. It is not even a reality of reason, reason stops with the cross and faith takes over.

But the empty tomb speaks a lot to our human experiences and our faith journey.

In our Christian journey, quite often a Good Friday situation slips into our lives. Indeed all of us have experienced a situation that seemed like the tomb – deep and dark, seemingly impossible to reverse. Those situations may be – a difficult diagnosis; the death of a loved one; difficult family relationships – loved ones no longer talking to each other; loss of a job, placing a parent in a care facility, and many others. Those situations may seem like the tomb – deep and dark

But no matter how desolate the situation has become, the Easter event tells us that the stone can be rolled away, the tomb can be empty.

And so as we examine the situation of the tomb and later of the empty tomb, we not only discover a spiritual truth but also we begin to realize that no situation is totally hopeless; we begin to realize that with faith in Jesus, every situation can be reversed.

We, therefore, experience resurrection when a loved one recovers from a difficult illness; when we are able to move on after the loss of a loved one; when brothers and sisters, parents and children reconcile with one another – when people forgive one another - when those without shelter find one, when the hungry are fed and the sick are cared for with love and compassion. We also experience resurrection when we provide comfort to a family during stressful times, when we give company to someone waiting for difficult news. We experience resurrection when a baby is not aborted, when that beautiful child is born.

And so, the empty tomb really represents the whole focus of our Christian faith - Jesus is alive! Jesus is Risen! Jesus is with us today! God is present among us here and now and in our Church. Yes St. James, let us all join together in spreading this good news. He has now blessed us with a new and beautiful remodeled church. Let us go out invite our brothers and sisters who no longer come to church to share this good news of the resurrection. Let us fill our pews to capacity! By doing this, we will truly acknowledge that even though we have come a long, long way, the Good news is that He is risen, Alleluia!

HEMOS VIAJADO MUCHO TIEMPO, PERO LA BUENA NOTICIA: EL HA RESUCITADO ALELUYA!

De hecho, hemos viajado mucho tiempo. Por cuarenta días, hemos hecho varios actos de piedad and ejercicios espirituales. Unos de nosotros dejamos de hacer nuestras actividades favoritas, no comimos ciertas comidas o líquidos que nos encantan. Hemos ayunado, rezamos un poco más, y también ayudamos al prójimo. ¿Por cuál propósito? Hicimos estas cosas para entrar más a profundo al misterio pascual de nuestro Señor Jesucristo.

Sobre los últimos cuantos días, vimos con horror la dolorosa traición de Nuestro Señor por su declarado íntimo círculo de amigos, los Apóstoles, a su hora más necesitada. Vimos la travestía flagrante de justicia cuando fue condenado por los líderes religiosos y la multitud a través de un juicio farsa, un juicio que a través de los siglos ha seguido escandalizando las mejor mentes legales del mundo. Entonces vimos su brutal y lenta ejecución en la cruz por los soldados romanos quienes continuaron de hacerle burla junto con los otros dos condenados. Cuando murió, una muerte que aparentemente acabo con una carrera exitosa de un gran maestro y hacedor de milagros, quien apenas hace una semana antes tenía multitudes que cantaban Hosanna en su honor. Qué semana, que drama dolorosa! De hecho hemos viajado mucho tiempo.

Sin embargo, además de todo esto, hay un feliz fin. La muerte no tiene la última risa, la vida sí---Él ha resucitado, Aleluya! Eso es lo que celebramos hoy! Él ha resucitado, la tumba está vacía! Sí, la tumba estaba vacía, y la tumba aún está vacía. Esa es la buena noticia de la Pascua.

La tumba vacía no es una prueba teológica seria sino es una indicación. Y esto lo es porque la resurrección no es una realidad de este mundo sino el que viene. Tampoco no es una realidad de tiempo y espacio sino de la eternidad. Ni tampoco solamente es una realidad de la razón, la razón para con la cruz y la fe se hace cargo.

Pero la cruz tiene mucho que decir sobre nuestra experiencia humana y nuestra caminata de fe.

En nuestra vidas Cristianas, hay veces que un Santo Viernes aparece en nuestras vidas. De hecho todos hemos experimentado situaciones que han parecido como tumba---profundas y oscuras, según parecen imposibles de reversarse. Esas situaciones pueden ser---un diagnosis difícil; la muerte de un ser querido; relaciones familiares difíciles—seres queridos que ya no se hablan; falta de trabajo, poner a un padre en un hogar de ancianos, y muchas más. Esas situaciones parecen como tumbas—profundas y oscuras.

Pero no importa que tan desolada la situación se ha hecho, el evento de la Pascua nos dice que la piedra se puede mover, la tumba puede ser vacía.

Entonces examinamos la situación de la tumba y después de la tumba vacía, no no más nos enteramos de un realidad espiritual pero también comenzamos a darnos cuenta que la situación no está completamente sin esperanza; comenzamos a darnos cuenta que con fe en Jesucristo, cada situación puede ser reversada.

Nosotros entonces, experimentamos la resurrección cuando un ser querido recupera de una enfermedad grave; cuando podemos seguir viviendo después de la muerte de un ser querido; cuando hermanos y hermanas, padres e hijos se reconcilian---cuando nos perdonamos unos a otros---cuando los desalojados encuentran casa, cuando los enfermos son cuidados con amor y compasión. También, experimentamos la resurrección cuando amparamos a una familia durante tiempos estresantes, cuando le damos compañía a alguien quien espera malas noticias. Experimentamos la resurrección cuando un bebé no es abortado, cuando ese bebé ha nacido.

Y entonces, la tumba vacía verdaderamente representa el enfoque de nuestra fe Crisitana---Jesucristo está vivo!!! Jesús ha resucitado! Jesús sigue con nosotros! Dios está presente hoy y a este momento y también en nuestra Iglesia. Sí St. James, vamos juntos a predicar esta buena noticia. Él ahora nos ha bendecido con una iglesia remodelada. Vamos a invitar a nuestros hermanos y hermanas que ya no vienen para compartir esta buena noticia de la resurrección. Vamos a llenar nuestras bancas a capacidad! En hacer esto, nosotros damos reconocimiento que aunque hemos viajado mucho tiempo, la buena noticia es que Él ha resucitado, Aleluya!


Ninth Day Today bring to Me SOULS WHO HAVE BECOME LUKEWARM.

Catechism of the Catholic Church

"The Resurrection—A Work of the Holy Spirit"

Paragraph 648

Christ's Resurrection is an object of faith in that it is a transcendent intervention of God himself in creation and history. In it the three divine persons act together as one, and manifest their own proper characteristics. The Father's power "raised up" Christ his Son and by doing so perfectly introduced his Son's humanity, including his body, into the Trinity. Jesus is conclusively revealed as "Son of God in power according to the Spirit of holiness by his Resurrection from the dead." St. Paul insists on the manifestation of God's power through the working of the Spirit who gave life to Jesus' dead humanity and called it to the glorious state of Lordship.






