St. James Youth Formation and Sacrament Preparation Classes 2024-2025



This family program is for families with children in kindergarten through 6th grade. It meets the first Wednesday of each month from Sept. to May from 6pm to 7:30pm. Students meet in classes, divided by grade level, where trained catechists present the lessons. Parents gather as a separate group where they are evangelized, catechized, encouraged, and equipped. This adult component is key to the transmission of Faith in the home. During the monthly gathering at the parish, families are given a packet of weekly lessons to use at home throughout the rest of the month. These Home Lessons are easy to use and have been developed and used by parents amidst typical busy family life. The lessons bring the whole family together to study and then apply the teachings to their day-to-day life. The lessons introduce families to a living encounter with Christ as they explore the basics of the Catholic faith. The Good News of the Gospel is a central element of each month's content.

This class is required for 7th –12th graders who are preparing for Sacraments. Eligible students are in their second or third year of faith formation, depending on age of starting formation—approval must be received prior to registering for this program. Meets most Thursdays in the Hall from 6pm to 7:30 beginning September 5th. Students must also be registered in either EDGE or Teen Group, depending on their grade level. Father John Loboka, AJ, PhD - Part 2

The following is taken from an interview Father did with eye Radio https://www.eyeradio.org/popes-translator-john-loboka-truly-happy-with-pontiffs-recognition/:

He joined Seminary at 13. When he joined the Seminary at the Apostles of Jesus in Rajaf, South Sudan, it was a secondary school and from that time forward they were being trained to become Missionaries. Father John Loboka was Ordained in October 1998.

Father Loboka is now a Ph.D. holder in Arabic and Islamic Studies, a Bachelor of Sacred Theology and has a Diploma in Philosophy among others.

Between 2005 - 2008 he served as Lecturer for Islam and Muslim Culture at the Pontifical Beda College, Rome.

He was also a visiting Lecturer at the Pontifical Institute of Arabic and Islamic studies in Rome between 2008 - 2014. Additionally, Father Loboka was the Vice-Rector of A.J. Major Seminary in Nairobi - Kenya between 2002-2003.

Other positions that Father has held include Rector for Apostles of Jesus Philosophicum, Nairobi, and the acting Rector for St. Paul's Major Seminary Philosophicum in Juba, South Sudan.

Father Loboka mainly taught the history of Islam, Islam, and Muslim Culture, Comparative Study of World Religions, Islam and Inter-religious Dialogue, Philosophy of Religions and Physics, Mathematics, Italian, and Latin among others.

According to him, he was inspired to become a priest to propagate the gospel and encourage South Sudanese to value humanity.
"I became a priest 25 years ago and my dream and desire were always to bring the good news of our Lord Jesus Christ to our people in South Sudan."

"So Christ has come to reveal to humanity what it really means to be human. Values of love, forgiveness, brotherhood these are essential values that we are South Sudanese we need to hear time and again."
