



GOSPEL

Jesus and his disciples left from there and began a journey through Galilee, but he did not wish anyone to know about it. He was teaching his disciples and telling them, "The Son of Man is to be handed over to men and they will kill him, and three days after his death the Son of Man will rise." But they did not understand the saying, and they were afraid to question him.

They came to Capernaum and, once inside the house, he began to ask them, "What were you arguing about on the way?" But they remained silent. They had been discussing among themselves on the way who was the greatest. Then he sat down, called the Twelve, and said to them, "If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all." Taking a child, he placed it in their midst, and putting his arms around it, he said to them, "Whoever receives one child such as this in my name, receives me; and whoever receives me, receives not me but the One who sent me."

REFLECTION ON THE 25TH SUNDAY.

This weekend we celebrate the 25th Sunday in ordinary time. We continue with our reflection on Jesus' teaching about the accomplishment of His paschal mystery through His passion, death, and resurrection.

One thing we need to keep in mind, my brothers and sisters, is that each generation and people at a given time in history, responds to life's burning question based on context in which they find themselves. The answer we give todays problems, for example, depends on what we know, or what we do not know. The story of the disciples of the Lord, which we read in todays Gospel, is a good example of such a situation. Like their contemporaries, they lived within the context, which made it difficult for them to understand the teachings of Jesus fully and right away. They were the product of their time; in the same way you and I are the product of our time.

We may take a cue from last Sunday's Gospel to understand the teaching of Jesus in today's Gospel. Last Sunday we heard Jesus speak to Peter saying: "You are thinking not as God does but as human beings do" (Mark 8:33). Something similar is happening in today's Gospel. Jesus is telling His disciples about the forthcoming tough moment in His life. For the first time He is speaking openly about the imminent danger He is about to face. He even speaks about the brutal death He is about to undergo. The disciples did not pay attention to all this. They are, on the contrary, seeing Jesus as a potential new political and religious leader of Israel. They, are therefore, discussing among themselves about the various positions of power they are about to assume. They even go a step further by comparing each other on the scale of prominence, to determine who is the greatest among them. Until this moment they have not yet understood the mission of Jesus. "They are thinking not as God does, but as humans beings do" (Mark 8:33).

Certainly, my dear brothers and sisters, you and I are not expected to think as God does but as human beings do. We are finite beings we will always be. However, we are challenged today to ask God to direct our thoughts in a humble, and a simple, childlike manner. Jesus is presented to us today as a *Servant Leader*. He uses the example of a child to pass across His message about *Servant Leadership*. We are called, therefore, to cultivate in our Christian servant leadership the virtues of humility, simplicity, docility, and innocence. By analogy, these are the same virtues that are exemplified in a childlike manner or fashion, like the one Jesus was holding.

The virtues which are alluded to in today's Gospel are the same virtues which St. James speaks about in the second reading, namely: purity, peace, gentleness, compliance, mercy, consistency, and sincerity (James 3:16-18)

A teaching to carry home with us: There are famous people who have exhibited the virtues of Servant Leadership in the world. We honor them because they did ordinary things in extraordinary ways. The list of such people is long. It includes Martin Luther King, Jr., Nelson Mandela, Mahatma Gandhi, Mother Teresa, Oscar Romero, John Paul II, Julious Nyerere... the list goes on and on.

Today, however, I ask you that we remember and recognize the Servant Leaders who remain anonymous among us. Their faces will neither appear on the front page of Time Magazine, nor will they appear on the list of CNN Heroes. These anonymous Servant Leaders are our personal heroes and mentors. They are people like you whom I am looking at now. They are our mothers and fathers, our sons and daughters, our sisters and brothers, our neighbors and the person sitting next to you. They are sometimes strangers who come into our lives at the time of need and disappear without telling their names. These people are like an ideal wife who is mentioned in the Book of Proverbs. (Proverb 31:10-31) They get up before dawn, when the rest of us are still in bed and they are the last ones to go to bed. They do much service for us, and we will never be able to pay them back.

May we pray for the grace, to persevere in exercising Servant Leadership in our "Little Ways" that leave great impacts to the lives of our dear neighbor and the world in which we live.

Allow me to conclude with the words of Mother Theresa about Servant Leadership: "Not all of us can do great things, but we all can do small things with greater love".

Let's go and do the same and Let's go and be Servant Leaders.

REFLEXIÓN DEL DOMINGO VIGESIMO QUINTO

Este fin de semana celebramos el domingo vigésimo quinto del tiempo ordinario. Continuamos con nuestra reflexión sobre las enseñanzas de Jesús sobre el cumplimiento de Su misterio pascual a través de Su pasión, muerte y resurrección.

Una cosa que debemos tener presente, hermanos y hermanas míos, es que cada generación y pueblo, en un momento dado de la historia, responde a la pregunta candente de la vida basándose en el contexto en el que se encuentran. La respuesta que damos a los problemas actuales, por ejemplo, depende de lo que sabemos o de lo que no sabemos. La historia de los discípulos del Señor, que leemos en el Evangelio de hoy, es un buen ejemplo de tal situación. Al igual que sus contemporáneos, vivían dentro del contexto, lo que les dificultaba comprender plena e inmediatamente las enseñanzas de Jesús. Fueron producto de su tiempo; de la misma manera tú y yo somos producto de nuestro tiempo.

Podemos seguir el ejemplo del Evangelio del domingo pasado para comprender la enseñanza de Jesús en el Evangelio de hoy. El domingo pasado escuchamos a Jesús hablar a Pedro diciéndole: "No piensas como Dios, sino como los hombres" (Marcos 8:33). Algo similar está sucediendo en el evangelio de hoy. Jesús les está contando a sus discípulos sobre el momento difícil que se avecina en su vida. Por primera vez habla abiertamente del peligro inminente que está a punto de afrontar. Incluso habla de la muerte brutal que está a punto de sufrir. Los discípulos no prestaron atención a todo esto. Por el contrario, ven a Jesús como un potencial nuevo líder político y religioso de Israel. Por lo tanto, están discutiendo entre ellos sobre las diversas posiciones de poder que están a punto de asumir. Incluso van un paso más allá al compararse entre sí en la escala de prominencia, para determinar quién es el más grande entre ellos. Hasta este momento todavía no han comprendido la misión de Jesús. "No piensan como Dios, sino como los seres humanos" (Marcos 8:33).

Ciertamente, mis queridos hermanos y hermanas, no se espera que ustedes y yo pensemos como Dios, sino como los seres humanos. Somos seres finitos y siempre lo seremos. Sin embargo, hoy tenemos el desafío de pedirle a Dios que dirija nuestros pensamientos de una manera humilde, sencilla e infantil. Jesús se nos presenta hoy como un Líder Servidor. Utiliza el ejemplo de un niño para transmitir Su mensaje sobre el Liderazgo de Servicio. Estamos llamados, por tanto, a cultivar en nuestro liderazgo de servicio cristiano las virtudes de la humildad, la sencillez, la docilidad y la inocencia. Por analogía, estas son las mismas virtudes que se ejemplifican de manera infantil, como la que Jesús sostenía.

Las virtudes a las que se alude en el Evangelio de hoy son las mismas virtudes de las que habla Santiago en la segunda lectura, es decir: pureza, paz, mansedumbre, conformidad, misericordia, coherencia y sinceridad (Santiago 3:16-18).

Una enseñanza para llevarnos a casa: hay personas famosas que han exhibido las virtudes del Liderazgo de Servicio en el mundo. Los honramos porque hicieron cosas ordinarias de manera extraordinaria. La lista de esas personas es larga. Incluye a Martin Luther King, Jr., Nelson Mandela, Mahatma Gandhi, la Madre Teresa, Oscar Romero, Juan Pablo II, Julious Nyerere... la lista sigue y sigue.

Hoy, sin embargo, les pido que recordemos y reconozcamos a los Líderes Servidores que permanecen anónimos entre nosotros. Sus rostros no aparecerán en la portada de la revista Time ni en la lista de héroes de CNN. Estos Líderes Servidores anónimos son nuestros héroes y mentores personales. Son personas como usted a quienes estoy mirando ahora. Son nuestras madres y padres, nuestros hijos e hijas, nuestras hermanas y hermanos, nuestros vecinos y la persona sentada a tu lado. A veces son desconocidos que llegan a nuestras vidas en el momento de necesidad y desaparecen sin decir sus nombres. Estas personas son como una esposa ideal que se menciona en el Libro de Proverbios. (Proverbio 31:10-31) Se levantan antes del amanecer, cuando el resto de nosotros todavía estamos en la cama y ellas son las últimas en acostarse. Nos prestan muchos servicios y nunca podremos pagarles.

Oremos por la gracia de perseverar en el ejercicio del Liderazgo de Servicio en nuestros "Pequeños Caminos" que dejan grandes impactos en la vida de nuestro querido prójimo y en el mundo en el que vivimos.

Permítanme concluir con las palabras de la Madre Teresa sobre el Liderazgo de Servicio: "No todos podemos hacer grandes cosas, pero todos podemos hacer pequeñas cosas con mayor amor".

Vayamos y hagamos lo mismo y seamos líderes de servicio.


