

Gospel - Lk 3:1-6

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was tetrarch of Galilee, and his brother Philip tetrarch of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias was tetrarch of Abilene, during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John the son of Zechariah in the desert.

John went throughout the whole region of the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the words of the prophet Isaiah:

A voice of one crying out in the desert:
"Prepare the way of the Lord,
make straight his paths.
Every valley shall be filled
and every mountain and hill shall be made
low.

The winding roads shall be made straight, and the rough ways made smooth, and all flesh shall see the salvation of God."

Evangelio - Lc 3, 1-6

En el año décimo quinto del reinado del César Tiberio, siendo Poncio Pilato procurador de Judea; Herodes, tetrarca de Galilea; su hermano Filipo, tetrarca de las regiones de Iturea y Traconítide; y Lisanias, tetrarca de Abilene; bajo el pontificado de los sumos sacerdotes Anás y Caifás, vino la palabra de Dios en el desierto sobre Juan, hijo de Zacarías.

Entonces comenzó a recorrer toda la comarca del Jordán, predicando un bautismo de penitencia para el perdón de los pecados, como está escrito en el libro de las predicciones del profeta Isaías:

Ha resonado una voz en el desierto:
Preparen el camino del Señor,
hagan rectos sus senderos.
Todo valle será rellenado,
toda montaña y colina, rebajada;
lo tortuoso se hará derecho,
los caminos ásperos serán allanados
y todos los hombres verán la salvación de Dios.

REV. FR. BITRUS T. MAIGAMO (PHD)



The Very Rev. Fr. Dr. Bitrus Teneu Maigamo is from Kaduna State, the North Central of Nigeria, West Africa. Born to the family of Zachariah Maigamo and Elizabeth Nchepteh he is the youngest with 4 brothers and no sisters. He started sensing the call of God while he was in the Minor Seminary when his people back at home had started calling him "Little Father". The desire to become a Catholic priest increased when he was halfway through training, but mingling with other friends, prior to his completion, there arose the desire to become a chemical engineer, nuclear physicist, or computer scientist. Nonetheless, having successfully completed the training he finally proceeded to the Senior Seminary. While in the Major Seminary, he was admitted into the Archdiocese of Kaduna. There he continued with his training of both philosophy and theology. On his completion, he was ordained a transitional deacon

under the Archdiocese of Kaduna alongside eleven colleagues. While as a deacon, the diocese of Zaria was carved out of the archdiocese of Kaduna in 2000 thereafter ordained for the diocese of Zaria, under Bishop George Dodo (now late), alongside his classmate as its first candidates on August 11, 2001 in Christ the King Cathedral. Since his ordination, he was given the first canonical assignment as the Vice Rector of his alma mater (St. Joseph Junior Seminary Zaria) and a Parochial Vicar of St. Endas Catholic Parish located within the Seminary. After five years of working experiences, he was made a Pastor of a newly erected Parish of St. Anne Catholic Church Zangon Tama II at the same time the Director of Communications of the Diocese. From there, in 2011 he was sent to Rome to study Missiology. During summer school breaks in Rome, Fr. Bitrus would come to Diocese of Phoenix to assist in parishes so the Pastor could take vacations. Fr. Bitrus has covered parishes in; Cottonwood, Sedona, Bullhead, Sun Lake, Mesa and Scottsdale during summer. In 2019, the Very. Rev. Fr. Dr. Bitrus Teneu Maigamo received his Doctorate in Rome based on his research on Islamic Extremism, and its Challenges to the Catholic Missionary Activity in Northern Nigeria since 1999: A Missiological Study. The plan after receiving his Doctorate was to return to native Nigeria to be formator at the Good Shepherd Senior Seminary, Kaduna. However by the generous hearts of Bishops Olmsted & Dodo (late), Father Bitrus returned to the Diocese of Phoenix. Then the unbelievable happened for this priest from a tiny Nigerian village! Dr. Bitrus received an international award as the Best Doctoral Dissertation Student for 2019/2020, by the Pontifical Gregorian University, Rome, Italy.

REFLECTIONS ON THE SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT.

This weekend we celebrate the second Sunday of Avent. Last Sunday we lit the candle of Hope. This weekend we light the candle pf Peace. This Sunday is called the Sunday of Peace. We take a step further on our Advent journey of Hope to Peace as we look forward to the two remaining Sundays – the Sunday of Joy and the Sunday of Love.

Like many of us, I have grown up accustomed to waiting, which is not to say I gladly welcome it in any sense. When I visit the post office, drop off my car for service, or go shopping, I expect that it will take time. While waiting, I look for something to keep me occupied. I read something on my phone, answer text messages or write some emails. In these moments of waiting, I experience restlessness and anxiety.

Last Sunday I shared with someone some of these personal experiences and my struggle with impatience when it comes to waiting. It was quite interesting when I realized that I am not alone in this. There are many of us who have similar experiences of impatience as we wait in line to be served.

All three of this Sunday's readings and the responsorial psalm, are wake up calls to us to prepare for the great encounter with the Lord. The first reading announces that God intends to show the glory of Christ to all nations. It we truly prepare for His coming, our hearts will overflow with joy, peace and love. Prophet Baruch tells us: "...take off your robe of mourning and misery; put on splendor of glory from God for ever..." (Baruch 5:1-9)

The Second reading remind us about the coming of the "Lord's Day." St. Paul encourages us to remain steadfast in good works and to continue improving our lives until the day of the Lord comes. It is important to note that in order to encounter Jesus Christ, and share in the joy that He brings, we must be willing to make some sacrifices. This entails preparing and purifying ourselves through prayer, love, and reconciliation. Hence, St. Paul says: "...This will help you to become pure and blameless and prepare you for the day of Christ..." (Philippians 1:8).

This week and next week, our gospel readings invite us to reflect more about personal relationship between St. John the Baptist and Jesus Christ. The Gospel of St. Luke has this special characteristic of connecting the births of St. John the Baptist and Jesus. Which is something we do find in the Gospels of Sts. Mark, Mathew and John. Indeed, the infancy narratives of St. John the Baptist and Jesus set the stage for the beginning of Jesus' public ministry.

In todays Gospel we also note Luke's special attention to the political and the historical context in which Jesus was born and lived. His is unique in mentioning political figures of the time like Tiberius Caesar and Pontius Pilate. He also mentions religious leaders: Annas and Caiaphas who were the high priests during that time. Lastly, he mentioned John the Baptist who was a prophet. By doing so St. Luke shows us that salvation is a free gift given to all people. Salvation brought by Jesus cuts across the political, religious and social context of all people, us included. We can make a distinction between religion or faith and politics, but we cannot separate them from each other.

The preaching of St. John the Baptist about the coming of the Lord is a key theme of the Advent season. St. John the Baptist prepared his contemporaries for the coming of Jesus. We too are called to prepare ourselves for Jesus' coming. We are invited to respond to John's message by repenting and reforming our lives.

Whatever constitute an obstacle to encountering Jesus Christ during this season must be completely removed as the voice of St. John the Baptist re-echoes clearly to us "... Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight His paths. Every valley shall be filled, and every mountain and hill shall be made low..." (Luke 3:5-6). Is there a mountain of pride in your life? Cut it and level your life to others in humility. Are there valleys of low self esteem in your life? Fill them up with optimism. Are there winding roads of sin in your life? Make your paths straight, with prayer and penance.

What then do we take home with us, this Second Sunday of Advent, the Sunday of Peace? Let us pray to God for the grace to establish a personal relationship with Jesus as it was between St. John the Baptist and Jesus. Three steps are necessary in order to establish such a personal with Jesus.

First, like St. John the Baptist, we are called upon to leave our comfort zones and go into the desert of prayer, penance, and sacrifice. Secondly, let us allow the spirit of Jesus or the word of God to come and speak to us. Thirdly, let us live our faith by proclaiming the wonders of God to others with joy and peace.

May Christ, the Prince of Peace, come and reign in our hearts. Amen.

REFLEXIONES DEL SEGUNDO DOMINGO DE ADVIENTO.

Este fin de semana celebramos el segundo domingo de Advento. El domingo pasado encendimos la vela de la Esperanza. Este fin de semana encendemos la vela de la Paz. Este domingo se llama Domingo de la Paz. Damos un paso más en nuestro viaje de Adviento de Esperanza hacia la Paz mientras esperamos con ansias los dos domingos restantes: el Domingo de la Alegría y el Domingo del Amor.

Como muchos de nosotros, he crecido acostumbrado a esperar, lo que no quiere decir que lo reciba con agrado en ningún sentido. Cuando visito la oficina de correos, cuando dejo mi automóvil para que lo revisen o voy de compras, espero que me lleve tiempo. Mientras espero, busco algo que me mantenga ocupado. Leo algo en mi teléfono, respondo mensajes de texto o escribo algunos correos electrónicos. En estos momentos de espera experimento inquietud y ansiedad.

El domingo pasado compartí con alguien algunas de estas experiencias personales y mi lucha contra la impaciencia a la hora de esperar. Fue bastante interesante cuando me di cuenta de que no estoy solo en esto. Hay muchos de nosotros que tenemos experiencias similares de impaciencia mientras esperamos en la fila para que nos atiendan.

Las tres lecturas de este domingo y el salmo responsorial son llamadas de atención para prepararnos para el gran encuentro con el Señor. La primera lectura anuncia que Dios tiene la intención de mostrar la gloria de Cristo a todas las naciones. Si realmente nos preparamos para Su venida, nuestros corazones rebosarán de gozo, paz y amor. El profeta Baruc nos dice: "...quítate tú manto de luto y miseria; Vístete del esplendor de la gloria de Dios para siempre..." (Baruc 5:1-9)

La Segunda lectura nos recuerda la llegada del "Día del Señor". San Pablo nos anima a permanecer firmes en las buenas obras y a seguir mejorando nuestra vida hasta que llegue el día del Señor. Es importante señalar que para encontrarnos con Jesucristo y compartir el gozo que Él trae, debemos estar dispuestos a hacer algunos sacrificios. Esto implica prepararnos y purificarnos a través de la oración, el amor y la reconciliación. Por eso, dice San Pablo: "... Esto os ayudará a ser puros e irreprensibles y a prepararos para el día de Cristo..." (Filipenses 1,8).

Esta semana y la próxima, nuestras lecturas del evangelio nos invitan a reflexionar más sobre la relación personal entre San Juan Bautista y Jesucristo. El Evangelio de San Lucas tiene esta característica especial de conectar los nacimientos de San Juan Bautista y Jesús. Que es algo que encontramos en los Evangelios de los Santos. Marcos, Mateo y Juan. De hecho, las narraciones de la infancia de San Juan Bautista y Jesús prepararon el escenario para el comienzo del ministerio público de Jesús.

En el Evangelio de hoy también notamos la especial atención de Lucas al contexto político e histórico en el que nació y vivió Jesús. El suyo es único al mencionar figuras políticas de la época como Tiberio César y Poncio Pilato. También menciona a los líderes religiosos: Anás y Caifás, quienes eran los sumos sacerdotes en ese tiempo. Por último, mencionó a Juan el Bautista que era un profeta. Al hacerlo, San Lucas nos muestra que la salvación es un don gratuito otorgado a todas las personas. La salvación traída por Jesús trasciende los contextos políticos, religiosos y sociales de todas las personas, incluidos nosotros. Podemos hacer una distinción entre religión o fe y política, pero no podemos separarlas unas de otras.

La predicación de San Juan Bautista sobre la venida del Señor es un tema clave del tiempo de Adviento. San Juan Bautista preparó a sus contemporáneos para la venida de Jesús. Nosotros también estamos llamados a prepararnos para la venida de Jesús. Estamos invitados a responder al mensaje de Juan arrepintiéndonos y reformando nuestras vidas.

Todo lo que constituya un obstáculo para encontrarnos con Jesucristo durante esta temporada debe ser eliminado por completo, como resuena claramente en nosotros la voz de San Juan Bautista: "... Preparad el camino del Señor, enderezad sus sendas. Todo valle será llenado, y todo monte y collado será rebajado..." (Lucas 3:5-6). ¿Hay una montaña de orgullo en tu vida? Córtalo y nivela tu vida a la de los demás con humildad. ¿Hay valles de baja autoestima en tu vida? Llénalos de optimismo. ¿Hay caminos sinuosos de pecado en tu vida? Endereza tus caminos, con oración y penitencia.

¿Qué nos llevamos entonces a casa, este Segundo Domingo de Adviento, el Domingo de la Paz? Oremos a Dios por la gracia de establecer una relación personal con Jesús como lo fue entre San Juan Bautista y Jesús. Son necesarios tres pasos para establecer esa relación personal con Jesús.

Primero, como San Juan Bautista, estamos llamados a dejar nuestras zonas de comodidad e ir al desierto de la oración, la penitencia y el sacrificio. En segundo lugar, dejemos que el espíritu de Jesús o la palabra de Dios venga y nos hable. En tercer lugar, vivamos nuestra fe proclamando las maravillas de Dios a los demás con alegría y paz.

Que Cristo, Príncipe de la Paz, venga y reine en nuestros corazones. Amén.


